SEXUAL ASSAULT

unwanted, coerced, sexual contact.

Physical contact can range from touching to rape.

COERCION CAN BE:

- Physical force
- Threat of harm
- Abuse of authority
- When the victim does not consent or cannot consent

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

- Get to a safe place.
- Seek medical care. You may be at risk for pregnancy or a sexually transmitted infection. If you do not want to trigger an investigation, then discuss the assault **ONLY** with Sexual Response Personnel or a healthcare provider.
- If you need immediate medical attention, call 911. This will trigger an investigation.
- To protect evidence, do not shower, wash your hands, eat, drink, brush your teeth, or change your clothes.
- Do not clean or straighten up the crime scene.

Reporting Options:

REPORT THE CRIME:

You **may** report the crime to law enforcement or to your chain of command. This will trigger an investigation.

MAKE A RESTRICTED REPORT/ REQUEST CONFIDENTIAL COUNSELING:

- Anyone who is eligible to use a military medical treatment facility can submit a restricted report.
- Directly contact your unit sexual assault response personnel (victim advocate) or health care provider.
- The victim advocate will help you seek confidential counseling, medical care, and other support without triggering a legal investigation.
